Dowsing for the murderer

'Map dowsers can locate anything they put their minds to.' That was the message from Tony at our map dowsing evening in January.

The Carole Hindes Room in Les Cotils was littered with tables carrying maps, mugs with hidden objects under them and a picture of three murderers!

Members were challenged to decide which of three people pictured was a convicted murderer - and it was no good looking at the ugliest and plumping for that one. Dowsing should reveal the one, or ones, with the bad energies of a killer. A few got the right answer but most learned that appearances are deceptive.

Tony demonstrated the different techniques of map dowsing - triangulation, using co-ordinates and dividing the map into grids and we all got down to finding the centre of power in Guernsey appropriate for us as individuals. And what was the current level in percentage terms, of beneficial energies in the island? Answers varied from 50% to 90% showing how beauty is in the eye of the beholder.

Finally, what were the current percentage levels of the two major reservoirs - Longue Hougue and St Saviours? The answers were 98.5% and 81% respectively. Only two dowzers were close but many weren't far off. No-one managed to accurately locate every hidden item - the coin, crystal, bottle of water, ring, essential oil, chocolate, book or piece of coal. Which means...keep on practising.

And the murderers? Out of the three, the two looking like the pleasant chaps next door were the killers - the one with the menacing sneer was the innocent one!

The Interconnectedness of All Things...

...Is the title of the latest book by our guest UK speaker in October.

Earmarked for our meeting on Friday, October 19, is John Gibson-Forty, author of the above publication.



For the last eleven years, John has been investigating ley lines and force fields of central Britain. And has mapped them all (see picture). Many connect with geographical features, stories from folklore, ancient history and spiritual beliefs. He has painstakingly linked them into a spider's web of connections described in his book.

The culmination of all his work is the realisation that in order to maintain balance, nature demands that everything has to have its equal and opposite counterpart, brought together by The Interconnectedness of All Things.

John is a medical practitioner in the field of Vibrational and Energetic medicine, which has included the disciplines of Osteopathy, Radionics and Energy Healing during his twenty years in the profession.

He has treated many grateful patients including one of the late Sir Alec Guinness' family, one of the pop group The Manfreds, and a member of the extended Royal family.

Having undertaken eleven years of training in the three disciplines, and now sitting on the Board of Examiners of the Keys College of Radionics, he has also undergone three years of self- and spiritual development.

He is also a professional Dowser, having specialised for over 15 years in energy patterns, earth energies such as Geopathic Stress, and the Human Energy Field for healing and health. These interests have taken him to Europe, Russia, China, Brazil and Hawaii.

He has already written and self-published booklets on An Introduction to Cranial Osteopathy, as well as Physical Injuries, Stress and Cranial Osteopathy, and is currently writing an updated version of An Introduction to Subtle Anatomy for the students of the Keys College of Radionics.

A HYPNOTIC EVENING...

Annie Dodd and her singing bowls! Sounds like an old vaudeville act, doesn't it? But we hadn't gone back in time; this was 21st Century Guernsey and Annie's bowls are perfectly designed to ease away the stresses of modern life.

However, the bowls do come from a bygone era - in fact from a Tibet that no longer exists. At the March meeting of the Health Special Interest Group Annie, and her son Sam, were our guest speakers. And their subject was the aforementioned bowls which were originally created by Tibetan monks to help fulfill all kinds of spiritual purposes - from aiding meditation to levitating in ecstasy!

They were manufactured by secret processes from a mixture of different metals. When struck or rubbed around the edge, they would create a unique resonance which would lift the user to a higher plane.



Annie explained that when China invaded Tibet and subsumed the country, killing the monks and sacking their monasteries, only a few bowls survived. Most of those in the world today are replicas. As Annie 'played' her various samples haunting sounds filled the air. One contained water and the resonance was making the liquid tremble and dance.

'Put your finger in the water,' Annie suggested. One member did and pulled it out quickly. 'It's like an electric shock,' she said. Annie said, 'What is happening to the water is also happening to the cells of your body, which are also made mostly from water - you are vibrating inside.'

Then it was our turn to have a go. Everybody tried their hand and Sue Taylor's conservatory was soon filled with musical tones - some high and insistent and others much lower and soothing.

If you fancy having a go, or even buying your own special bowl (dowse first to make sure you get the right bowl for you), they will be available at Annie's new shop in St Peter Port's Old Quarter. It's called 'Stoned' - perhaps denoting the hypnotic effect the singing bowl has!

‘What a wonderful weekend!’

That was the comment from one of the 24 people who attended Adrian Incledon-Webber's Spiritual Dowsing workshop at Torteval Church Hall in March. And it wasn't just the weather they were referring to, although it was perfect on both days making the rural setting rather magical.

Adrian led us through how to heal the earth and ourselves; we learned how to create a sacred space and use its healing energies. As we dowsed these energies, they changed and developed reflecting our own personalities and the intent we brought with us. We left the 'stone circle' we created in the hall overnight and when we came back the next day the energies had grown, drawing in resonances from the landscape and the environment around us.

This was a practical demonstration of how we each influence our living spaces all the time and made us aware of our responsibilities, in this regard, in our daily lives.

'Always ensure you protect yourselves,' Adrian urged, as he explained that there are invisible, detrimental energies all around us, including other people's thought patterns. By creating a defensive barrier, a cocoon of white light, around us, we fend off harmful vibrations.

'Everything is energy and energy is everything,' said Adrian using a quote from Albert Einstein to explain how immersed we all are in an ocean of competing energetic influences, both good and bad.

Then it was off to St Peter's Church to dowse the energies there and to confirm or confound a grim story of murder and execution!

Apparently, the Rev Jean Perchard's wife died unexpectedly in 1616. An old woman of the parish, Collette Dumont, confessed under torture to have caused her death by means of powers from the Devil.

On 4 July 1617 Mrs Dumont was burned at the stake along with her daughters, Marie and Isabel Bequet, also as witches. Mr Perchard died in 1653 and lies buried in the churchyard. So was the site of the burning nearby? And does it need healing? After a diligent search our dowsing told us 'No' so it was on to a more routine dowsing exercise.

What a strange sight for any visitors - people seemingly in some sort of trance walking about slowly holding pendulums or L-shaped rods. 'There's definitely something here,' one of us would exclaim. And suddenly a swarm of dowsers would home in on the spot to check for themselves. Yes, we confirmed there is water running under the church and some powerful energy lines. Some felt a negative spiral a few yards down from the altar.

'Churches often contain a mix of beneficial and detrimental energies which is quite logical, if you think about it,' said Adrian. People come into churches full of both negative and positive emotions and this will leave an imprint.' Overall, we dowsers decided that the parish church of St Pierre du Bois was rather pleasant and time spent in its environs would be beneficial.

On Day 2 we looked at how to locate water veins and check their effect on our energy auras and using symbols for personal and environmental healing. 'Heal your home, to heal yourself,' was Adrian's mantra when he took us through the basics of geopathic stress. Our auric field is continually under attack so we need to do what we can to protect ourselves.

Our pendulums whizzed but 'not so fast,' said Nigel

The Power of the Pendulum was the subject of our February meeting at Les Cotils and Nigel Clarke led this fascinating evening with his usual sense of fun. He began by showing ways to make a pendulum with very little cost: Jewellery parts from Oatlands for £4.90 or a hanging basket chain, which makes three for 70 pence. The most surprising however was the roll of plumbing tape for 60p!

We were reminded of the importance of "protection" and after establishing how to recognise our signs for "yes, no, and need more information" we were raring to go with pendulums whizzing! "Not so fast," said Nigel, and he then went on to explain that our dowsing brains could not work properly if they were all bunged up with clutter such as wondering whether we had remembered to turn the gas off or thinking about what to cook for supper! He then told us how to get rid of all our clutter by imagining the face of a clock and counting round the numbers.

We began by asking our pendulums "quality questions" about ourselves such as name, eye colour, car owned, etc. and were reminded to take great care to ask the questions accurately. We then worked with a partner with one holding their pendulum while the other asked questions silently. This was a brilliant idea because we could be absolutely certain that the pendulum was not being influenced because its owner knew the answers.



Liz Adams had made a crystal pendulum and when using it at her home had found that it could nearly always identify fragments from the same crystal if they were hidden underneath one of three cups. She brought this along for us to try but unfortunately results were disappointing. This was put down to too much argumentative energy in the room!

Our final challenge was to identify a collection of seven objects hidden under seven cups - a pound coin, a conker, a silver Guernsey milk can, a bottle of apple oil, a granite pebble, a pine cone and a pearl earring. We'd all had the opportunity to examine, handle and sniff the items throughout the evening hoping that this would help us locate them but sadly our results were far from brilliant. Our answers were recorded in order to try and establish any links between them. Did some people get the same wrong answers? Were some people better at finding organic substances? Or metals?

Analysis of these results showed the following:

'Hidden under the cup' results. 14 people took part. Under cup 1. A bottle of apple oil (3 people got it!) the other 11 dowsers found.....2 conkers, 3 coins, 3 pebbles, 1 pine cone and 2 pearl earrings.

Under cup 2. A pound coin. (3 people got it!) the other 11 dowsers found.....1 conker, 1 silver milk churn, 2 pine cones, 6 pearl earrings and 1 bottle of apple oil.

Under cup 3. A pine cone (2 people got it !) the other 12 dowsers found.....1 coin, 2 silver milk churns,3 conkers, 3 bottles of apple oil, 2 pebbles and 1 pearl earring.

Under cup 4. A granite pebble (3 people got it!) the other 11 dowsers found.....2 conkers, 4 silver milk churns, 3 bottles of apple oil, and 2 pearl earrings.

Under cup 5. A conker (2 people got it!) the other 12 dowsers found....2 coins, 1 silver milk churn, 2 bottles of apple oil, 4 pebbles, 2 pine cones and 1 pearl earring.

Under cup 6. A pearl earring (2 people got this!) the other 12 dowsers found...2 coins, 2 conkers, 2 silver milk churns, 2 pebbles, 1 bottle of apple oil and 3 pine cones.

Under cup 7. A silver milk churn (4 people got this!) the other 10 dowsers found...5 coins, 1 conker,1 pebble, 2 cones and 1 pearl earring.
